As in past years, this report demonstrates Duke University's steady progress toward the goal of providing participation opportunities
and athletic financial aid to women in proportion to their undergraduate enrollment (47%). In 1999-2000, wom ceived 37.9% of athletic aid; in
2000-01, that figure was 40%.
Women's athletic financial aid at Duke has increased by 13% since 1996. Scholarships will continue to be added over the next two or three years
to bring the women's share of athletic aid to approximately 47%.
